A location plan will be sent out with your ticket.



#### RATIONALE

There is a special relationship between the arts-based therapies and Jungian analysis. All share common ground in working with the healing capacities of the imagination. This exciting and innovative conference sets out to explore the links from experiential, historical and conceptual perspectives. Jung described how important the imagination was to him, whether painting, carving, playing with stones and water, or developing the clinical method known as active imagination. Jungian ideas are featured prominently on arts-based therapy courses and, conversely, many Jungian analysts make use of expressive techniques in their work. This conference interweaves workshops in different kinds of arts-inspired therapy with discussions on the connections to Jungian psychology and analysis. The workshops are an opportunity to explore different levels of experience and to make connections between the verbal and the non-verbal.

#### WORKSHOPS

Numbers are strictly limited and workshops will be allocated as bookings are received.

We would emphasise that the workshops are not therapy workshops.

#### ART THERAPY WORKSHOPS

Workshop No.1: Joy Schaverien—Jungian Analyst (SAP), Professor (Associate) Art Psychotherapy, University of Sheffield. Dreams and Active Imagination: explore through paint, pastels, paper and play. Workshop No.2: Mary-Jayne Rust—Jungian Analyst (SAP), Art Therapist. Playing with clay, exploring relationships between psyche and body, soul and the land.

Workshop No.3: Julia Ryde—Jungian Analytical Psychotherapist (BAP), Art Therapist. "To Put You in the Picture" - making images and telling stories using a range of art materials.

Workshop No.4: Martin Robinson—Jungian Analyst (AJA), Art Therapist. Image as narrative: exploring (through paint and other materials) dream, story and imagination as process.

Workshop No. 5: David Melagan—Writer, Artist and Art Therapist. An imaginal approach based on some of James Hillman's ideas: using fantasy to explore the 'aesthetic' features of images and to warm them with imagination.

Music Therapy Experiences: the theme will be a journey of free musical improvisations upon which we will reflect.

Workshop No.10: Shayne Spitzer—Jungian Analyst (AJA), Dance/Movement Therapist. "Kinaesthetic active imagination": a non-stylised, self-directed movement experience creating an embodiment of inner images and process.

Workshop No.11: Nina Papadopoulos—Dance/Movement Therapist and Psychologist. The workshop will offer an opportunity to explore our inner images and connect with shared group themes through movement and dance.

Workshop No.12: Maggie Baron — Sandplay Therapist in private practice.
